

**Beginning Band
Syllabus
2007-2008**

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Welcome to Beginning Band at Ridgeview! This class is going to teach you the skills needed to perform music on brass, woodwind, and percussion instruments. You will learn to assemble, disassemble, and take good care of your own instrument.

Materials Needed

Standard of Excellence Book 1 (Red)
Pencil
Instrument

Grading Scale (All are worth 25% of your grade)

Daily participation (bringing your instrument and playing)	10 points
Weekly Playing Tests	10 points
Practice Cards (weekly)	20 points
Concerts	100 points

Playing Tests

There will be a weekly playing test to ensure proper practicing is taking place and to demonstrate improvement on your instrument.

Practice Cards

Every Monday there will be a practice card to be turned in at the beginning of class. You are expected to practice for two hours a week (which equals out to about 17 minutes a day). The most improvement will always be done in individual practice sessions. You will lose 2 points for every 15 minutes that are not practiced.

Concert Attendance

Attendance at every concert is required and a part of your grade in band. When playing music, the concert is your big test and your practicing is your studying. If there is an issue that comes up, please notify me as soon as possible.

Concert Attire

Men: White shirt, black dress pants, black socks, black shoes.

Women: White shirt/blouse, black pants/skirt (skirt must be full length), black closed toed shoes.

These are all REQUIRED materials that need to be brought every day to class along with your instrument. The only optional material which is strongly recommended is to have a name tag for your instrument.

4 **PLAYABLE** reeds at all times (at least #2 strength)

Bassoon

Cleaning swab (if at all possible, obtain a silk swab)

4 **PLAYABLE** reeds at all times (medium strength)

Saxophone

Cleaning swab (if at all possible, obtain a silk swab)

4 **PLAYABLE** reeds at all times (at least #2-2.5 strength)

Trumpet

Valve oil

Slide grease

Mouthpiece brush

Horn

Valve oil

Mouthpiece brush

Trombone

Slide grease (for tuning slide)

Slide lubricant (for main slide)

Mouthpiece brush

Euphonium/Tuba

Valve oil

Slide grease

Mouthpiece brush

Bell kit (practice pad, snare sticks, bells and mallets)
