

Intermediate Choir Syllabus

2006-2007

Units:

- Quarter I: Basic Theory Principles, Basic Sight Singing, Fall Concert Music
Quarter II: Basic Theory Principles, Winter Concert Music
Quarter III: Basic Theory Principles, Spring Concert
Quarter IV: Basic Theory Principles, End of the Year Concert

Grading:

Music theory will be studied throughout the year and make up 1/5 of your grade.

Participation will take up 1/5 of your grade:

Daily Grade -Five daily points can be achieved per day. These are based on whether you come to class prepared (music/pencil), professional, on time, respectful and whether your attitude toward your director and your peers is appropriate.

Concert Reports will take up 1/5 of your grade:

A concert report is a one page critique on a vocal concert of your choice. You may not be a participant in this concert and it **must** include vocal music. There will be **one** per Quarter. You must critique the vocalist's technique, musicality and dramatic performance for each piece performed.

Concerts will take up 1/5 of your grade.

Concert attendance - 100 points per concert.

Concerts are mandatory test experiences. Students must arrive on time and stay for the duration of the concert. (Mandatory concert dates on back.) If you have an excused absence from a concert, you will be required to make up the experience by writing a report on a related subject. (Given by Mrs. Faust-Frodl) If you have an unexcused absence, you will receive a zero and will be unable to make up the concert grade. (Excused/Unexcused determined by Mrs. Faust-Frodl and Dr. Moore.) Appropriate behavior is mandatory and will be graded for the duration of the concert.

Concert attire:

Men - A white, collared, long-sleeve, buttoned down dress shirt; black slacks, black socks and black dress shoes. Ridgeview will provide a black vest and bow tie. (Students are not allowed to bring these items home as they are property of Ridgeview Classical's Vocal Dept.)

Women - A white, collared, long-sleeve, buttoned down dress shirt; dark, closed-toe dress shoes. Ridgeview will provide a black skirt, black vest and bow tie. (Students are not allowed to bring them home as they are property of Ridgeview Classical's Vocal Dept.)

(*The Final Concert* may have different concert attire than stated above depending on music selection and student costume availability. Ladies may be required to wear black slacks.)

Clothing Agreement: A \$25.00 deposit will be collected before the first concert. If the clothing is ruined or not returned at the end of each concert, Ridgeview will charge you the full cost of the clothing as well as use the \$25.00 deposit for shipping and handling. There may be special circumstances in which students may have to bring their vests, bow ties and skirts home overnight. They must be returned by the next school day.

Private lessons will take up 1/5 of your grade:

Three, fifteen minute private lessons should be scheduled with me **each quarter**. A student may have a maximum of one lesson per week. (Exceptions will be made if a solo or small group performance is soon to arrive.)

Class Rules:

1. Always do your best.

2. Be Professional -

Treat others with Respect - you will receive the same.

Sharpen pencils before class begins.

Be prepared - unprepared students lose their points from their daily grade.

(Please have your music **and a pencil** ready at all times. We move quickly - notes will have to be made in the music daily.)

Take neat, legible notes - theory notes are your responsibility.

3. Listen with your mind, not just your ears.

My classroom is not a study room for tests or unfinished homework. You may not read, do math, or study for upcoming tests in class. Warm-ups are an opportunity for you to work on your vocal technique, not study. (Pink slips will be administered to people that take advantage of late policies.)

4. If you are sick and feel you cannot participate, you must go to the nurse's office.

If the nurse sends you back to me, you must participate unless you have a severe case of laryngitis. Not participating will leave you with an "F" for the day.
