

Latin II Course Expectations

Rationale: Having already had a year or more of Latin, you have learned the basics. This year we will take a more reading-based approach, reviewing and discussing grammar thoroughly as we meet it in text.

Homework/translations: Expect to do homework and/or study for vocabulary every evening. According to Ridgeview policy, homework that is one day late will receive only 50% credit, and 0% after the first day.

Oral quizzes: Once each week, there will be an oral quiz over the chapter(s) covered. You will be tested on the accuracy of your pronunciation and translation.

Vocabulary: You will take a vocabulary quiz over one or more chapters periodically. You may also be tested on derivatives (English and foreign words derived from Latin) that we have discussed in class.

Tests: Unit tests will be a combination of vocabulary, derivatives, paradigms, sentences for grammar analysis, and short translations of Latin.

Participation: You will be informally assessed throughout the period. Participating means that you are actively involved in class discussions and prepared for class each day. As part of the participation grade, I may check the organization and completeness of your binder at any time.
