Ridgeview Classical Schools Intermediate Orchestra class will offer a continuation of musical development as an intermediate level performing organization. The focus for this class will be to continue learning the fundamentals of his/her instrument and to study and perform music literature from all style periods. Students will work to improve their skills in all areas of music including rehearsal, performance, theory, history, sight-reading, analysis, evaluation, and listening. Performances will be given in both solo and ensemble settings. Concerts and other ensemble performances will be scheduled outside the regular school day.

Rehearsals: Equipment will consist of the following items: student, instrument, bow, shoulder rest, rosin, mute, pencil, music, cassette tape for recording at home (optional)

Required texts that need to be purchased: Essential Elements 2000 Book 2 for Strings with CD/DVD; My Music Journal (book)

Required items that need to be purchased (students should already have most of these): Rosin, mute, pencil, shoulder rest (violin/viola), rock stop (cello/bass), extra set of strings (violin/viola) --> they do not have to be new

Suggested items to be purchased, but not required: Tuner/Metronome, solo books, tape recorder and tape to record on

Concert Attire: Gentlemen: Black pants, black shirt, black dress shoes, black socks.

Ladies: Mid-calf (or longer) length black dress w/ sleeves (long or short) or black dress slacks with black blouse, or black mid-calf (or longer) length skirt w/ black blouse, black closed toe dress shoes.

The spring pops concert on May 16th will have alternate dress attire.

Performances: All performances with the Ridgeview Classical Schools Orchestra are mandatory, and are worth 25% of the grade. Since the performances are live, there is no equitable way to 'make-up' a performance. Absences will be excused on an individual basis by Miss Bigelow and an alternative assignment will be given for excused absences. Any unavoidable conflicts should be brought to Miss Bigelow's attention several weeks in advance. Unexcused absences will earn a zero in the gradebook, and an alternate assignment will not be given. Mandatory concerts are listed on the back of this syllabus.

Students will be expected to attend (and be on time to) all rehearsals. These rehearsals will be in school and outside of school time. Any unavoidable conflicts should be brought to Miss Bigelow's attention several weeks in advance.

Grading: The orchestra grade will be a combination of the following categories: Quizzes = 25% Concerts = 25%; Class Participation = 25%; Practice Records = 25%. Quiz Grades consist of required playing and written quizzes and tests completed during the school day. Concerts grades are comprised of the student's individual performance, attitude, behavior, dress, and for arriving on time and staying until the end of the concert. These mandatory concerts are listed on the back of the syllabus. The Class Participation grade will consist of the student's preparation on a daily basis, having all equipment as listed above every day, taking their instrument and music home, and behavior in class. Practice Record Grades consist of weekly grades that are signed by the parent/guardian that state how many minutes the student has practiced in a seven day week. The student is required to practice a minimum of 30 minutes a day with one day off for a total of 180 minutes per week for an A.

In addition, second semester students need to either attend the Core Knowledge Music Festival (audition only!), participate in PSD's Solo & Ensemble Festival, or play a solo or in a small ensemble in Ridgeview's Solo & Ensemble concert. Participation in one of these activities will be the quiz grade for 4th quarter.
