### BOD Action October 25, 2007

- Auditor presented financials, noting RCS' strong cash position.
- Auditor explained need for separate schedule to show capital expenses.
- Request for additional equipment for fitness classes, approved.
- Use of new search engine "Good Search" will generate revenue for Ridgeview, the fundraising committee will send out details soon.
- One grievance filed, AAC recommends there be a policy related to investigating allegations of cheating. BOD needs more information.
- \$10,800 approved to improve lighting in PAC (house lighting).
- Approved purchase of lanyards for faculty to use with photo id and keys, if they chose.
- Adopted revisions to dress code policy and homework policy. (see back)
- Graduation Dress will not specify the color of skirts/dresses as long as the garment does not show. If the garment will extend beyond the graduation gown, it must be uniform and a dark color. Women (both faculty and students) may wear slacks, these must also be uniform and a dark color.

## **Policy SE-4.2**

### **Dress Code**

Following the second offense of the dress code, the violator will be required to wear a black and white uniform for a certain amount of time as defined by the Assistant Principal. ## **Policy AP-5.0**

### **Homework**

Homework is an essential part of education. As such, students at all grade levels will have assignments to work on and complete on a daily basis. Parents should be supportive of this policy by providing a suitable, quiet place to work, free from intrusion by other family members and the various media.

Homework should be an opportunity for practice or for acquisition of background material. Parents are not expected to “teach” material to students.

In order to take an AP class, all students must first get parental approval on the required AP Class Request form as well as the teacher's recommendation for that class which is at the bottom of the AP Class Request form.

AP classes will require anywhere from 30 to 60 extra minutes of homework per night beyond the usual amount required for high school. Therefore the school recommends that students take no more than two AP classes per semester. Any more classes than two will require special approval by the principal.

9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students may elect to be scheduled in an additional study hall in lieu of an elective. No credit will be awarded for study hall. Students who do not use this time wisely will be required to enroll in an elective.

In order to give 9<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> grade students adequate time to write papers and prepare for tests, the last week of each quarter, starting the preceding Friday, will be a “Quiet Week.” No major performance will be scheduled during this time without prior approval by the principal. These weeks will be scheduled each year when the annual school calendar is created.

All assignments must be turned in on time. Half credit will be given for assignments that are one day late. No credit will be given for work turned in more than one day late. Medical conditions are the only routinely excused absences. Students have one school day for each day missed to turn in assignments and make up missed work. Absences for any other reasons must be excused by the principal.

Homework will not be sent home nor will credit be awarded for any work done during periods of unexcused absence.
